for foreign visitors to Japan, is pleased to launch the
"Keisei Skyliner & Tokyo Subway Ticket" and
"Skyliner Return Ticket" Now on sale!

As of Saturday, March 26, 2016, Keisei Electric Railway Co., Ltd. (head office: Ichikawa, Chiba Prefecture; president: Norio Saigusa; hereinafter referred to as "Keisei") has added the "Keisei Skyliner & Tokyo Subway Ticket" and "Skyliner Return Ticket" to the ticket options available via Keisei's online sales service for foreign visitors to Japan, "Skyliner e-ticket: Fastest Access from Narita to Downtown Tokyo".

"Skyliner e-ticket" is a service that enables you to purchase "Skyliner" express and passenger tickets online using a credit card. Skyliner offers comfortable and convenient airport access, whisking you between Narita Airport and Tokyo city center in as little as 36 minutes. Until now "Skyliner" tickets were sold on a one-way basis only. With the addition of the "Keisei Skyliner & Tokyo Subway Ticket" and "Skyliner Return Ticket", Keisei is significantly enhancing its lineup of ticketing options. Now foreign visitors to Japan can enjoy more convenient and affordable travel in Japan than ever.

The "Keisei Skyliner & Tokyo Subway Ticket" is a plan passenger ticket that offers discounted travel specially for foreign visitors to Japan. The ticket combines one-way or return fare on the "Skyliner" with the "Tokyo Subway Ticket", which provides free travel on 13 subway lines (nine lines of the Tokyo Metro Subway plus four lines of the Toei Subway) for 24 hours, 48 hours or 72 hours*. Until now these tickets had been available for purchase at the Skyliner counters in Narita Airport Terminal 1 Station and Narita Airport Terminal 2•3 Station, at travel agencies and aboard low-cost carriers. These tickets can now be purchased online*, making the "Keisei Skyliner & Tokyo Subway Ticket" and "Skyliner Return Ticket" more convenient than ever.

Purchase of a "Skyliner" return ticket offers even more affordable travel than the one-way ticket.

Keisei is working hard to ensure that foreign visitors to Japan can enjoy a convenient, comfortable, safe and reliable travel experience.

Addition of the "Skyliner e-ticket" to the Skyliner Ticket Lineup

1. **Tickets added**
 - (1) "Keisei Skyliner & Tokyo Subway Ticket"
 - (2) Skyliner Return Ticket

2. **Launch date** Saturday, March 26, 2016

3. **How to purchase**
 - 1) Purchase online from your PC or smartphone. Access the Keisei website and enter the type of ticket, number of people in your party, travel dates, credit-card information, passport number and other required information.
 - 2) When the procedure is complete, the website will issue a "Ticket Exchange number".
 - 3) When you arrive in Japan, present your passport and "Ticket Exchange number" at any of the exchange locations listed below. The ticket of the requested type will be issued there.
 - Locations where voucher numbers can be exchanged for tickets
 - SKYLINER & KEISEI INFORMATION CENTER
(in Narita Airport Terminal 2•3 Station)
 - At the Skyliner ticket counter in Narita Airport Terminal 1 Station or Narita Airport Terminal 2•3 Station
 - At the arrivals-level counter in the Narita Airport Terminal buildings

Note: The currently available one-way "Skyliner" tickets can be picked up at the Skyliner counters at Nippori Station and Keisei Ueno Station, as well as at the locations listed above.

 - Maximum number of persons in party
 Eight persons (total of adults and children)

 Tickets can be purchased as early as 20 days before use.
